Rev. Samoris Hall (CMS Ret)

Rev. Samoris Hall is a native Washingtonian. He is the son of the late Deacon Talmadge Hall and Deaconess Lucille C. Hall and had one sister, Marian J. Ballard. Samoris accepted Christ into his life at the tender age of 8 at Jordan Baptist Church in Capitol Heights, Maryland where he served as a Jr. Deacon under Pastor William J.
